Assistant Professor (tenure track). Highly qualified candidates will be considered at higher rank.

Institutional Requirements:

To be considered for appointment, the candidate must wholeheartedly endorse the Mission Statement and the Statement of Faith of the University (see <http://www.kingsu.ca/about-us/>). The successful candidate must demonstrate graduate level course work in the areas of teaching or related experience. A Ph.D. in a field related to human physiology or kinesiology (human health, physiology and/or anatomy, physical education) is required. Candidates with post-doctoral experience are preferred.

Teaching Responsibilities:

Six term courses or equivalent per year, may include labs and seminars.

Particulars of the Position:

The successful candidate should be able to teach courses in Kinesiology, Human Anatomy and Physiology, Exercise Physiology, and Growth and Development. They will be required to work closely with other natural science faculty to deliver courses and contribute to an interdisciplinary learning environment. The successful candidate will be committed to a faith-based approach to teaching and learning. The Faculty at The King's University are recognized for involving undergraduate students in their scholarship, with some faculty members having obtained external funding.

Appointment:

Subject to budget approval.
