High school applicants will be considered based on the following requirements:

- ▶ Grade average of 60% or higher
- ▶ Approved Grade 12-level English course
- ▶ Three standard Grade 12 courses
- ▶ One additional standard or non-standard Grade 12 course

Scholarships & Student Finance

Students are considered for scholarships based on the average of their top four standard courses:

90-100%	\$3,000
80-89%	\$2,000

A scholarship of \$1,500 is available to students transferring from another institution with a cumulative GPA of 3.50 – 4.00.

Federal and provincial government aid is available for students who qualify. Applications must be submitted to your province or territory of residence.

Apply for government aid at least six weeks prior to the start of classes to ensure funds arrive on time.
